It has been a while since I wrote, and so much has happened that it is hard to know what all to write about, so I will give a brief overview in pictures. We were glad to have Marc, Dorcas & Sarah here for a visit.

Hannah had dengue during the time of their visit, so we mostly stayed around home. The Church sister had tamales for hot-lunch at school during the time they were here, so they had an enjoyable time together.

We also had an enjoyable time with Sarah's nephew Morris Miller and family. The children enjoyed the time with their children and they pitched in with the work at hand. Marc had made a stand for Sarah's bread-slicer, but did not have time to get it finished, so Morris was able to get it finished, and then got some drawers installed in a

cabinet that uncle Mervin had made on an earlier visit.

The picture below is the group that went to the prison in Co-mayagua for a service. We went to share the Good News of Salvation with them, but we came away encouraged by the Church within the prison. Brother Chepino was preaching at 11:00 which is their lunch

time, so he asked whether he should bring his message to a close, and they said "no,"

rather keep on with the preaching, so there were probably about 200 men that missed their lunch that day so they could hear more of the Word and visit with us. After the message one of the prisoner/pastors gave the invitation, and around 7 men responded. We were there visiting from about 9:30am till 2:00pm and they want us to come again as soon as we can.





Last Sunday we went to ‘Pane’ to visit and heard that the daughter of a family we know in Matazano had died that morning. We went over to be with the family that evening and had a short service with the family. Thursday, one of the sisters had met this mother and daughter in town and visited with them. The daughter was fine on Thur., but started with a fever on Saturday and died Sunday morning. Monday a group of us went back for the burial and ended up being there all day helping where we could.

Tuesday we visited four schools and were encouraged in seeing that our labors are not in vain. One local school teacher was reading a story from the “101 Bible Stories” for their morning devotions, and another teacher had her book lying on top of the desk with a bookmark in it. She said she also reads a story to the children every morning. The Kindergarten class wanted to sing the song “Las Estellitas” that they had learned on a visit last year, and have obviousness been singing ever since. At another school we met 7 children who had recently come from the USA to live with their grand-



ma & do not yet know Spanish. We waited till the grandma came and visited with her. She said she had been praying about a church to take the children to, and said just that morning God had told her that she did not need to look for a church but that the church would come to her. We took her home to see where they live, and this morning they came to church. She wanted to dedicate her grandchildren to the Lord, so we had a short dedication service after the message.

Kevin & Brenda Fall had been staying in our basement while we were getting a few more things done at the house. This past week they were able to unpack their crates and got moved into the house. We had thought of having the services in our basement again, but the church brethren would rather have it in the new church building, “as is” with a tarp for shade. We had several other visitors this morning, which made for a nice sized group. Pray that the Word sown would bear fruit in the lives of those that hear.
